

# WORKSHOP PRESENTER:

Ms. Davis has carried out many workshops nationally and around New England on collections care topics and in particular workshops in emergency preparedness, response and salvage. Davis was chosen as one of ten professionals nationwide to participate in the (AIC) American Institute for Conservation's "Train the Trainers" program in 2000 to teach emergency preparedness, response and salvage to other museum professionals in regional workshops. This was accomplished with her colleague, objects conservator, Barbara Moore. Since then Moore and Davis have written and presented extensively on these topics. (Examples follow)
